Approaching hurdle number 8 all riders were alerted that hurdle 9 had been closed due to R. Eynon being incapacitated and requiring medical attention. As a consequence, the field was required to run to the outside of hurdle 9. After being alerted all runners except NORDIC DUKE (NZ) jumped the 8th hurdle. Shortly thereafter a number of riders restrained and eased their mounts down as there was not sufficient room, and it was unsafe, for the field to navigate around the 9th hurdle as the First Care Medical vehicle was stationary to the outside of the hurdle. Riders were further alerted that the race was not going to proceed; however, as the First Care Medical vehicle had been moved in the interim, after the runners were restrained, the field was able to navigate around the 9th hurdle. Thereafter and despite being alerted a number of runners continued and completed the course while other runners were eased out. The race was declared void by stewards under AR139.

LIKE YOU LOOK – No action taken as Like You Look, despite making slight contact with the top of the hurdle was inconvenienced on landing and therefore could not be blamed solely for the incident
